DUNN SCHOOL HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE CALIFORNIA BOYS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-10, 175-pound senior forward scored 25 goals and passed for 15 assists this past season, leading the Earwigs (9-3-2) to the Southern Section Division VI Tournament. A three-time team MVP, Danladi is a two-time Southern Section Division VI First Team selection and is ranked as the nation's No. 22 recruit in the Class of 2014 by College Soccer News.

Danladi has maintained a 3.08 GPA in the classroom. He has volunteered locally at a nature reserve, as a youth soccer coach and as a summer camp counselor.

"Abu Danladi is a beast. He's big, strong, fast and highly skilled," said Pete Mack, head coach of the Cate School. "Every time he touched the ball, my heart pounded faster."

Danladi has signed a National Letter of Intent to play soccer on an athletic scholarship at UCLA this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
