FRANKLIN HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT-ATHLETE NAMED GATORADE OREGON BOYS TRACK & FIELD PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (June 22, 2017) — In its 32nd year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, today announced **Henry Mong of Franklin High School** as its **2016-17 Gatorade Oregon Boys Track & Field Athlete of the Year**. Mong is the first Gatorade Oregon Boys Track & Field Athlete of the Year to be chosen from Franklin High School.

The award, which recognizes not only outstanding athletic excellence, but also high standards of academic achievement and exemplary character demonstrated on and off the track, distinguishes Mong as Oregon's best high school boys track & field athlete. Now a finalist for the prestigious Gatorade National Boys Track & Field Athlete of the Year award to be announced in June, Mong joins an elite alumni association of state track & field award-winners, including Lolo Jones (1997-98, Roosevelt High School, Iowa), Allyson Felix (2002-03, Los Angeles Baptist High School, Calif.), Robert Griffin III (2006-07, Copperas Cove High School, Texas), Grant Fisher (2013-14 & 2014-15, Grand Blanc High School, Mich.) and Candace Hill (2014-15, Rockdale County High School, Ga.).

The 6-foot-2, 165-pound senior won the 800-meter run with a time of 1:51.38 as well as the 1500 in 3:50.52 at altitude at the Class 6A state meet this past season. Mong's winning time in the 1500 ranked as the nation's No. 3 performance among prep competitors in 2017 at the time of his selection, and his season-best time of 1:51.38 in the 800 ranked No. 30 nationally.

Mong has volunteered locally on behalf of Kateri Park Catholic Charities and youth sports programs. "Henry is a focused and ferocious competitor who combines a studious approach to learning the training, tactics, and the lore of his sport with a pure passion for racing," said Franklin coach Jacob Michaels. "I have never seen that combination at such a high level in a high school athlete before, in any sport."

Mong has maintained a 3.60 GPA in the classroom. He has signed a National Letter of Intent to compete on an athletic scholarship at the University of San Francisco this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade Player of the Year Selection Committee, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.

Mong joins recent Gatorade Oregon Boys Track & Field Athletes of the Year Harrison Schrage (2015-16, Grant High School), Julian Body (2014-15, Jesuit High School), Matthew Maton (2013-14, Summit High School), Beau Brosseau (2012-13, Oregon City High School), Jefferson Jarvis (2011-12, Hidden Valley High School), Ryan Crouser (2010-11, Sam Barlow High School), Sam Crouser (2009-10, Gresham High School), Elijah Greer (2008-09, Lake Oswego High School), Nathan Mathabane (2007-08, Lincoln High School), and Kenny Klotz (2006-07, Central Catholic High School) among the state's list of former award winners.

As a Gatorade Player of the Year, Henry will be able to select a national or local youth sports organization to receive a grant as part of the Gatorade Play It Forward program. Every Gatorade Player of the Year state winner receives a \$1,000 grant to donate and will have the opportunity to enter for an additional \$10,000 spotlight grant by writing a brief essay explaining why their selected organization deserves additional support. 12 spotlight grants – one for each sport – will be announced throughout the year.
