**TIMBER CREEK REGIONAL HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT-ATHLETE NAMED
GATORADE NEW JERSEY BOYS FOOTBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR**

CHICAGO (December 11, 2017) — In its 33rd year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, today announced Devin Leary of Timber Creek Regional High School as its 2017-18 Gatorade New Jersey Football Player of the Year. Leary is the first Gatorade New Jersey Football Player of the Year to be chosen from Timber Creek Regional High School.

The award, which recognizes not only outstanding athletic excellence, but also high standards of academic achievement and exemplary character demonstrated on and off the field, distinguishes Leary as New Jersey's best high school football player. Now a finalist for the prestigious Gatorade National Football Player of the Year award to be announced in December, Leary joins an elite alumni association of state award-winners in 12 sports, including Mitchell Trubisky (2012-13, Mentor High School, Ohio), Greg Olsen (2002-03, Wayne Hills High School, N.J.), Matthew Stafford (2005-06 Highland Park High School, Texas), Harrison Smith (2006-07 Knoxville Catholic High School, Tenn.), Latavius Murray (2007-08, Onondaga High School, N.Y.), Brock Osweiler (2008-09, Flathead High School, Mont.) and Leonard Fournette (2014-15 & 2012-13, St. Augustine High School, La.).

The 6-foot-2, 195-pound senior quarterback passed for 2,863 yards and 31 touchdowns this past season, leading the Chargers to a 10-1 record and the South Jersey Group 3 semifinals. The state's returning Gatorade Football Player of the Year, Leary completed 152 of 246 passes and was intercepted just seven times. He also rushed for 344 yards and four touchdowns on 36 carries. The NJ.com Player of the Year as a junior, he concluded his prep career with state records for both passing yards (9,672) and touchdowns (105).

Leary has volunteered locally on behalf of the Camden Rescue Mission, a food bank and youth football programs. "Devin Leary is the best high school quarterback I've seen," said P.J. Mehigan, former head coach at Cherokee High. "He has all the physical capabilities and all the mental capabilities of a great quarterback. What separates him is his ability to remain poised under duress. Whether he's blitzed, hit, behind in a game, nothing seems to faze him."

Leary has maintained a 3.05 GPA in the classroom. He has verbally committed to play football on scholarship at North Carolina State University in the fall of 2018.

The [Gatorade Player of the Year](#) program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade Player of the Year Selection Committee, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.

Two-time winner Leary joins Gatorade New Jersey Football Players of the Year Jordan Fuller (2015-16, Northern Valley Regional High School at Old Tappan), Brandon Wimbush (2014-15, Saint Peter's Preparatory School), Mark Fossati (2013-14, Saint Joseph Regional High School), Jonathan Germano (2012-13, Bergen Catholic High School), Jamauri Bogan (2011-12, Union High School), Savon Huggins (2010-11, Saint Peter's Prep.), and Tony Jones (2009-10, Don Bosco Preparatory School) among the state's list of former award winners.

As a Gatorade Player of the Year, Leary will be able to select a national or local youth sports organization to receive a grant as part of the Gatorade Play It Forward program. Every Gatorade Player of the Year state winner receives a \$1,000 grant to donate and will have the opportunity to enter for an additional \$10,000 spotlight grant by writing a brief essay explaining why their selected organization deserves additional support. 12 spotlight grants - one for each sport - will be announced throughout the year.
