VERMILLION HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT-ATHLETE NAMED GATORADE® SOUTH DAKOTA BOYS BASKETBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (March 8, 2018) — In its 33rd year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, today announced A.J. The 6-foot-2, 175-pound senior guard led the Tanagers to a 13-9 record and the regional semifinals this past season. Plitzuweit averaged 33.9 points, 9.3 rebounds, 4.3 assists and 2.9 steals per game. The Dakota 12 Conference MVP, he was a First Team All-State honoree and a member of the Argus Leader First Five.

Plitzuweit has volunteered locally on behalf of youth basketball programs. "A.J. Plitzuweit is one of the best high school basketball players I've ever seen," said Paul McVey, head coach at Lennox High. "His shooting range is phenomenal, his free throw stroke is impeccable and he might have the best pull-up game I've ever witnessed. He's incredibly efficient and he's also a terrific rebounder and defender."

Plitzuweit has maintained a 3.77 GPA in the classroom. He has signed a National Letter of Intent to play basketball on scholarship at Augustana University this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade Player of the Year Selection Committee, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.

Plitzuweit joins recent Gatorade South Dakota Boys Basketball Players of the Year Matt Cartwright (2016-17, O'Gorman High School), Ty Hoglund (2015-16, Dell Rapids High School), Deng Geu (2014-15, Washington High School), Justin Decker (2013-14, Huron High School), Zach Hanson (2012-13 & 2011-12, TF Riggs High School), Zach Horstman (2010-11, Winner High School), Jared Hannigan (2009-10, Central High School), Tony Fiegen (2008-09, Madison High School), Louie Krogman (2007-08, White River High School), and Dale Moss (2006-07, Brandon Valley High School) among the state's list of former award winners.

As a Gatorade Player of the Year, A.J. will be able to select a national or local youth sports organization to receive a grant as part of the Gatorade Play It Forward program. Every Gatorade Player of the Year state winner receives a \$1,000 grant to donate and will have the opportunity to enter for an additional \$10,000 spotlight grant by writing a brief essay explaining why their selected organization deserves additional support. 12 spotlight grants – one for each sport – will be announced throughout the year.
