## PORTSMOUTH HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT-ATHLETE NAMED GATORADE RHODE ISLAND GIRLS TRACK & FIELD PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (June 21, 2018) — In its 33<sup>rd</sup> year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, today announced Nikki Merrill of Portsmouth High School as its 2017-18 Gatorade Rhode Island Girls Track & Field Athlete of the Year. Merrill is the third Gatorade Rhode Island Girls Track & Field Athlete of the Year to be chosen from Portsmouth High School.

The award, which recognizes not only outstanding athletic excellence, but also high standards of academic achievement and exemplary character demonstrated on and off the track, distinguishes Merrill as Rhode Island's best high school girls track & field athlete. Now a finalist for the prestigious Gatorade National Girls Track & Field Athlete of the Year award to be announced in June, Merrill joins an elite alumni association of state track & field award-winners, including Lolo Jones (1997-98, Roosevelt High School, Iowa), Allyson Felix (2002-03, Los Angeles Baptist High School, Calif.), Robert Griffin III (2006-07, Copperas Cove High School, Texas), Grant Fisher (2013-14 & 2014-15, Grand Blanc High School, Mich.) and Candace Hill (2014-15, Rockdale County High School, Ga.).

The state's returning Gatorade Girls Track & Field Athlete of the Year, the 5-foot-4 junior swept the 800-meter run and the 1,500-meter run for a second straight year at the state meet this past season, leading the Patriots to a sixth-place finish as a team. Merrill also took ninth at the New Balance Nationals Outdoor in the 800, and her clocking of 2:08.90 came within a half-second of the state record and ranked No. 20 in the nation among prep competitors this spring at the time of her selection. She also was ranked nationally in 2017 the 1,500-meter run (4:37.73, No. 38) and the Mile run (4:56.56, No. 64).

Merrill has volunteered locally at an animal shelter and she has donated her time as part of multiple initiatives through her school's Community Service Club. "Nikki has continued to excel from her amazing sophomore year," said Jeff Rose, head coach of Portsmouth High. "She is a tremendously hard-working athlete and a motivator to all of her teammates."

Merrill has maintained a weighted 3.99 GPA in the classroom. She will begin her senior year of high school this fall.

The <u>Gatorade Player of the Year</u> program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade Player of the Year Selection Committee, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.

Two-time winner Merrill joins Gatorade Rhode Island Girls Track & Field Athletes of the Year May Stern (2015-16, Classical High School), Quashira McIntosh (2014-15, Hope High School), Maddy Berkson (2013-14, 2012-13 & 2011-12, Classical High School), Aleide Fernandes (2010-11, Central Falls High School), Molly Reilly (2009-10, South Kingstown), Eryn Wheeler (2008-09, Coventry), and Victoria Flowers (2007-08 & 2006-07, Classical) among the state's list of former award winners.

As a Gatorade Player of the Year, Merrill will be able to select a national or local youth sports organization to receive a grant as part of the Gatorade Play It Forward program. Every Gatorade Player of the Year state winner receives a \$1,000 grant to donate and will have the opportunity to enter for an additional \$10,000 spotlight grant by writing a brief essay explaining why their selected organization deserves additional support. 12 spotlight grants – one for each sport – will be announced throughout the year.
