CENTURY HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT-ATHLETE NAMED GATORADE IDAHO VOLLEYBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (January 15, 2019) — In its 34th year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, today announced **Zoe Thiros of Century High School** as its **2018-19 Gatorade Idaho Volleyball Player of the Year**. Thiros is the fourth Gatorade Idaho Volleyball Player of the Year to be chosen from Century High School.

The award, which recognizes not only outstanding athletic excellence, but also high standards of academic achievement and exemplary character demonstrated on and off the field, distinguishes Thiros as Idaho's best high school volleyball player. Now a finalist for the prestigious Gatorade National Volleyball Player of the Year award to be announced in January, Thiros joins an elite alumni association of state award-winners in 12 sports, including USA Volleyball players Kayla Banwarth (2006-07, Wahlert Hight School, Iowa), Alisha Glass (2005-06, Leland Public High School, Mich.), Jordan Larson (2004-05, Logan View High School, Neb.) and Foluke Akinradewo (2004-05, St. Thomas High School, Fla.).

The 5-foot-11 senior outside hitter led the Diamondbacks to a 37-5 record and the Class 4A state championship this past season. Thiros recorded 450 kills, 380 digs, 69 blocks and 57 service aces. The Idaho State Journal Player of the Year and a three-time First Team All-State selection, she was also named a PrepVolleyball.com All-American and a 2018-19 Under Armour Honorable Mention All-American.

A devoted member of her church community, Thiros has volunteered locally on behalf of a Vacation Bible School, Marshall Public Library, youth volleyball camps and a coat drive. "Zoe Thiros elevated her game to a different level this year," said Kamille Crawford, head coach at Middleton High. "She dominates no matter where she is on the court; she's a force in the front row and the back row. She's a six-rotation kid who impacts the game tremendously."

Thiros has maintained a 4.0 GPA in the classroom. She has signed a National Letter of Intent to play volleyball on scholarship at Gonzaga University this fall.

The <u>Gatorade Player of the Year</u> program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade Player of the Year Selection Committee, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.

Thiros joins recent Gatorade Idaho Volleyball Players of the Year Dani Nay (2017-18, 2016-17, Skyview High School), Maya Taylor (2015-16, Idaho Falls High School), and Kayla Ellis (2014-15 & 2013-14, Century High School), among the state's list of former award winners.

As a part of Gatorade's cause marketing platform "Play it Forward," Thiros has the opportunity to award a \$1,000 grant to a local or national youth sports organization of her choosing. She is also eligible to submit an essay to win one of twelve \$10,000 spotlight grants for the organization of choice, which will be announced throughout the year.

Since the program's inception in 1985, Gatorade Player of the Year award recipients have won hundreds of professional and college championships, and many have also turned into pillars in their communities, becoming coaches, business owners and educators.
