

**GRANDVIEW PREPARATORY SCHOOL STUDENT-ATHLETE  
NAMED GATORADE FLORIDA GIRLS BASKETBALL PLAYER OF  
THE YEAR**

CHICAGO (March 13, 2026) — In its 41<sup>st</sup> year celebrating the nation’s best high school athletes, Gatorade today announced Jasleen Green of Grandview Preparatory School is the 2025-26 Gatorade Florida Girls Basketball Player of the Year.

Gatorade Player of the Year is the top honor in high school sports, celebrating the nation’s best high school athletes for their excellence in sport, academics and community. The award recognizes Green as Florida’s best high school girls basketball player, and she joins an elite legacy that spans professional athletes and coaches to CEOs, such as Candace Parker (2002-03 & 2003-04, Naperville Central High School, IL) Paige Bueckers (2020-21, Hopkins High School, MN) and Aaliyah Chavez (2024-25, Monterey High School, TX).

The 5-foot-9 senior guard led the Pride to a 26-4 record and the Class 1A state championship this past season. Green averaged 17.8 points, 4.9 rebounds, 2.0 assists and 2.0 steals, and recorded 16 points, seven boards and three assists in Grandview’s 71-37 win over Orlando Christian Prep in the state final. The 2025 Miami Herald Player of the Year, she is a three-time Broward County Player of the Year.

Green has volunteered locally as part of community-beautification projects and as a youth basketball coach. She has also donated her time collecting hygiene items for the homeless. “When I think Gatorade Player of the Year, I think consistent, stone-cold killer who has gone up against the best and didn’t waver,” said Georgia Taylor, head coach of Martin County High School. “That person is Jasleen Green.”

Green has maintained a 3.80 GPA in the classroom. She has signed a written letter of athletic aid to play basketball at the University of Arizona this fall.

The [Gatorade Player of the Year](#) program annually recognizes one state winner from each of the 50 states and Washington D.C., in 12 different sports: football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, baseball, softball, boys and girls soccer, and boys and girls track & field. In total, 610 high school athletes are honored each year. From the pool of state winners, one national winner is selected in each of the 12 sports. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade Player of the Year Selection Committee, which leverages experts including coaches, scouts, media and others as sources to help evaluate and determine the winners in each sport.

As part of Gatorade’s commitment to breaking down barriers in sport, every Player of the Year also receives a grant to donate to a social impact partner. To date, the Gatorade Player of the Year program has provided more than \$6.4 million in grants to winners across more than 2,200 organizations.
