

CORONADO HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT-ATHLETE NAMED GATORADE NEVADA BOYS BASKETBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (March 20, 2026) — In its 41st year celebrating the nation’s best high school athletes, Gatorade today announced Munir Greig of Coronado High School is the 2025-26 Gatorade Nevada Boys Basketball Player of the Year.

Gatorade Player of the Year is the top honor in high school sports, celebrating the nation’s best high school athletes for their excellence in sport, academics and community. The award recognizes Greig as Nevada’s best high school boys basketball player, and he joins an elite legacy that spans professional athletes and coaches to CEOs, such as Jayson Tatum (2015-16, Chaminade College Preparatory School, MO), Cooper Flagg (2023-24, Montverde Academy, FL) and Cameron Boozer (2022-23 & 2024-25, Christopher Columbus High School, FL).

The 6-foot-6, 200-pound junior guard led the Cougars to a 17-8 record and the Class 5A state championship this past season. Greig averaged 15.9 points, 7.8 rebounds, 3.2 assists and 1.7 steals while connecting on 40.3 percent of his 3-point shots. He totaled 18 points, eight rebounds, three assists and two steals in Coronado’s 60-55 win over Liberty High School in the state final. A transfer from Archbishop Carroll (Pa.) High School, he was a First Team All-State selection.

A sports representative on the Coronado High School student council, Greig has volunteered locally with the Special Olympics and the National Charity League. “Munir is a rangy athlete oozing with upside,” said Matt McKay, Pro Insight Founder & CEO. “His versatility is a separator, as he’s a terror in transition – the dribble-pass-shoot flashes are enticing, and his defensive potential is sky high.”

Greig has maintained a B average in the classroom. He will begin his senior year of high school this fall.

The [Gatorade Player of the Year](#) program annually recognizes one state winner from each of the 50 states and Washington D.C., in 12 different sports: football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, baseball, softball, boys and girls soccer, and boys and girls track & field. In total, 610 high school athletes are honored each year. From the pool of state winners, one national winner is selected in each of the 12 sports. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade Player of the Year Selection Committee, which leverages experts including coaches, scouts, media and others as sources to help evaluate and determine the winners in each sport.

As part of Gatorade’s commitment to breaking down barriers in sport, every Player of the Year also receives a grant to donate to a social impact partner. To date, the Gatorade Player of the Year program has provided more than \$6.4 million in grants to winners across more than 2,200 organizations.
