

**BISHOP MANOGUE CATHOLIC HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT-ATHLETE NAMED
GATORADE NEVADA BASEBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR**

CHICAGO (June 1, 2026) — In its 41st year celebrating the nation’s best high school athletes, Gatorade today announced Keenan Dolan of Bishop Manogue Catholic High School is the 2025-26 Gatorade Nevada Baseball Player of the Year.

Gatorade Player of the Year is the top honor in high school sports, celebrating the nation’s best high school athletes for their excellence in sport, academics and community. The award recognizes Dolan as Nevada’s best high school baseball player and he joins an elite legacy that spans professional athletes and coaches to CEOs, such as Clayton Kershaw (2005-06, Highland Park, TX), MacKenzie Gore (2016-17, Whiteville High School, NC) and Seth Hernandez (2024-25, Corona High School, CA).

The 6-foot-5, 215-pound senior right-handed pitcher and outfielder led the Miners (30-11) to the Class 5A state championship game this past season. Dolan compiled an 8-3 record on the mound with a 1.55 ERA, striking out 85 batters in 63.1 innings pitched. Ranked as the nation's No. 129 prospect in the Class of 2026 by Prep Baseball Report, he was the 2026 Prep Baseball Report Nevada Class 5A Player of the Year and a two-time PBR Futures Game participant. He also batted .427 with nine home runs this spring, producing 50 RBI, 43 runs and a 1.342 OPS.

A National Honor Society member and team captain, Dolan has volunteered locally with the Northern Nevada Children’s Cancer Foundation. He has also donated his time to a community cleanup non-profit and has served Project 150, which supports homeless, displaced and disadvantaged students. “In our area, Keenan Dolan is in a class of his own,” said Rusty Bendle, head coach at Galena High School. “He’s a dominant two-way player and a fantastic human being to go with it.”

Dolan has maintained a 3.98 GPA in the classroom. He remains undecided on a collegiate destination.

The [Gatorade Player of the Year](#) program annually recognizes one state winner from each of the 50 states and Washington D.C., in 12 different sports: football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, baseball, softball, boys and girls soccer, and boys and girls track & field. In total, 610 high school athletes are honored each year. From the pool of state winners, one national winner is selected in each of the 12 sports. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade Player of the Year Selection Committee, which leverages experts including coaches, scouts, media and others as sources to help evaluate and determine the winners in each sport.

As part of Gatorade’s commitment to breaking down barriers in sport, every Player of the Year also receives a grant to donate to a social impact partner. To date, the Gatorade Player of the Year program has provided more than \$6.4 million in grants to winners across more than 2,200 organizations.
