## BIDDEFORD HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® MAINE VOLLEYBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Grigware has maintained a weighted 5.05 GPA on a 6.0 scale in the classroom. Also a basketball and track standout, she has volunteered locally at an area soup kitchen and has donated her time fundraising to benefit the Make-A-Wish Foundation.

"Grigware is an excellent hitter and a strong server," said Lisa Curley, head coach of rival Gorham High. "She never stops—she has that great determination to finish every play."

Grigware remains undecided upon a collegiate destination.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by ESPN RISE and the Gatorade high school sports leadership team, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.

Grigware joins recent Gatorade Maine Volleyball Players of the Year Michaela Campbell (2009-10 & 2008-09, Greely) and Mariah Grover (2007-08, Mount Desert Island) among the state's list of former award winners.
