LONDONDERRY HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® NEW HAMPSHIRE VOLLEYBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 2010 New Hampshire Volleyball Coaches Association Division I Co-Player of the Year with her twin sister, Megan, Katie Schwarz is a two-time NHVCA First Team All-State selection and a two-time *Lawrence Eagle-Tribune* All-Area selection.

Schwarz has maintained a 3.94 GPA in the classroom and ranks No. 3 in her class. A member of the Mu Alpha Theta Mathematics Honor Society and the National Spanish Honor Society, she has volunteered locally with the Special Olympics and the Relay for Life.

"Katie Schwarz can play outside and middle," said Karen Harrington, Schwarz's club coach with Latitude 42. "She knows the game very well and has a high volleyball IQ. She can play any position on the court."

Schwarz will attend Johns Hopkins University next fall, where she will play volleyball.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by ESPN RISE and the Gatorade high school sports leadership team, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.

Schwarz joins recent Gatorade New Hampshire Volleyball Players of the Year Maria Kuehl (2009-10, Farmington), Amanda Saab (2008-09, Salem) and Lauren Laquerre (2007-08, Concord) among the state's list of former award winners.
