## LINCOLN HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® OHIO BOYS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-8, 150-pound junior midfielder recorded nine goals and 12 assists this past season, leading the Lions (22-0-1) to the Division 1 state championship. A member of the U.S. Soccer Federation Under-18 Men's National Team, Trapp was an All-American selection by the National Soccer Coaches Association of America and is the No. 3-rated recruit in the country for the Class of 2011 by TopDrawerSoccer.com.

Trapp has maintained a 3.98 GPA in the classroom. A member of the Gahanna Lincoln High School Varsity Choir, he has volunteered at a local YMCA and as an altar boy at his church.

"Wil Trapp is definitely a top-notch player, without a doubt," said Jon Sprunger, head coach of rival Worthington-Kilbourne High. "He's the catalyst on that team that makes the whole team function. The player that controls the middle of the field and is as unselfish as he is—everyone knows he's the key, and he still sets his teammates up for fantastic goals. That's their success."

Trapp will begin his senior year of high school this fall.
