## LASSITER HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® GEORGIA BOYS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-8, 148-pound junior midfielder and defender led the Trojans (12-4) to the Class 5A state tournament this season, recording three goals and eight assists. A current member of the U.S. Soccer Federation Under-18 Men's National Team, McCrary spent his sophomore year of high school in residency with the Under-17 Men's National Team in Bradenton, Fla. He is the nation's No. 26 recruit in the Class of 2011 as rated by TopDrawerSoccer.com.

McCrary has maintained a B average in the classroom. He has volunteered locally as a youth soccer coach and as part of a fundraising campaign to benefit diabetes research.

"His work ethic—that is what sets Jordan apart," said Gregg Blasingame, director of coaching with the Concorde Fire. "Is he huge? No. But he's got good pace and he's strong. He just gives 110 percent every time he steps on the field. He's continually working and he consistently performs at a high level."

McCrary has verbally committed to play soccer on scholarship at the University of North Carolina beginning in the fall of 2011.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by ESPN RISE and the Gatorade high school sports leadership team, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
