UNION HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® OKLAHOMA BOYS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-9 senior midfielder had recorded 14 goals and 14 assists at the time of his selection, leading the Redskins (10-1) to Friday's Class 6A quarterfinal playoff game with Edmond Santa Fe. A three-time All-District 3 and All-Frontier Valley Conference selection, Mata has been named to this year's All-State Team and will play in Europe this summer for the Disney Soccer Showcase All-Star Team.

Mata has maintained a 3.83 GPA in the classroom. He has volunteered locally on behalf of youth soccer programs and camps.

"Mata is fast and smart and very good technically," said Seth Condley, head coach of rival Stillwater High. "He can change a game in an instant with one touch of the ball."

Mata has signed a National Letter of Intent to play soccer on scholarship at the University of Tulsa this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by ESPN RISE and the Gatorade high school sports leadership team, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
