MARCUS HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® TEXAS BOYS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-10, 160-pound senior midfielder led the Marauders (17-3-4) to the Class 5A regional quarterfinals this past season, recording 15 goals and six assists. A 2009 ESPN RISE First Team All-American selection and a National Soccer Coaches Association of America High School and Youth All-American, Barnes is the nation's No. 7 recruit in the Class of 2010 as rated by TopDrawerSoccer.com. He spent his sophomore year of high school in residency with the U.S. Soccer Federation Under-17 Men's National Team in Bradenton, Fla., and concluded his varsity career with 38 goals and 20 assists.

Barnes has maintained a B average in the classroom. He has volunteered locally as a mentor at an elementary school in Flower Mound and as a youth soccer coach.

"He's an all-around player; he's good in the air and good on the ground," said Hassan Nazari, Barnes' club coach with the Dallas Texans. "Zach's strength is that he's always consistent, he's always doing things on both sides of the ball. Everything that he does, he does very well."

Barnes has signed a National Letter of Intent to play soccer on scholarship at Southern Methodist University this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by ESPN RISE and the Gatorade high school sports leadership team, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.

Barnes joins recent Gatorade Texas Boys Soccer Players of the Year Dillon Powers (2008-09, Plano), Sam Garza (2007-08, Marcus), and Corben Bone (2006-07, Plano) among the state's list of former award winners.
