RIVERBEND HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® VIRGINIA BOYS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (May 6, 2010) — In its 25th year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with ESPN RISE, today announced Ryan Zinkhan of Riverbend High School as its 2009-10 Gatorade Virginia Boys Soccer Player of the Year. The 5-foot-9, 150-pound junior forward had led the Bears (8-0-2) to the No. 6 ranking in the Metro area by the Washington Post at the time of his selection, recording 13 goals and six assists. A two-time First Team All-Commonwealth District selection, Zinkhan is a member of the U.S. Soccer Federation Under-18 Men's National Team pool, having participated in three national team camps since the beginning of the 2009-10 school year.

Zinkhan has maintained a 3.81 GPA in the classroom. He has volunteered locally as part of multiple community service initiatives in association with his church youth group.

"Ryan does everything for the team on both sides of the ball," said Erwan Le Crom, Zinkhan's club coach with the Richmond Strikers. "His best trait is his quickness. He scores on counter attacks. Once he gets behind defenders, he's gone. He can get in between players or turn quickly around defenders—I've always been impressed how quickly he can turn with the ball."

Zinkhan has verbally committed to play soccer on scholarship at the University of Virginia beginning in the fall of 2011.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by ESPN RISE and the Gatorade high school sports leadership team, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.

Zinkhan joins recent Gatorade Virginia Boys Soccer Players of the Year Will Bates (2008-09, Thomas Dale), Christian McLaughlin (2007-08, Herndon), and Uche Onyeador (2006-07, Potomac Falls) among the state's list of former award winners.
