CHEYENNE CENTRAL HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® WYOMING BOYS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (May 6, 2010) — In its 25th year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with ESPN RISE, today announced Kevin Cox of Cheyenne Central High School as its 2009-10 Gatorade Wyoming Boys Soccer Player of the Year. The 5-foot-8 senior forward had recorded 13 goals and two assists at the time of his selection, leading the Indians to an 8-1-2 mark entering a May 6 regular-season game with Laramie. A First Team All-State selection in 2008 and 2009, Cox led Class 4A in goals each of those seasons and has broken Cheyenne Central's career scoring record with 56 goals to this point.

Cox has maintained a 4.00 GPA in the classroom. An active member of his church youth group, he has volunteered locally on behalf of the Cheyenne Animal Shelter and youth soccer programs.

"Cox is very composed, level-headed, surgical with his finishing," said Andy Pannell, head coach of rival Laramie High.
"He's the most dangerous goal scorer in the state, far and away."

Cox remains undecided upon a collegiate destination.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by ESPN RISE and the Gatorade high school sports leadership team, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.

Cox joins recent Gatorade Wyoming Boys Soccer Players of the Year Ben Borin (2008-09, Cheyenne East), Zach Johnson (2007-08, Kelly Walsh), and Sam Hayden (2006-07, Jackson Hole) among the state's list of former award winners.
