## CONWAY HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® ARKANSAS BOYS BASKETBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

An All-State selection the last two seasons, Purifoy averaged 15.8 points, 5.0 rebounds and 1.8 blocks per game.

Purifoy has maintained a 3.34 GPA in the classroom. An active member of his church community, he has volunteered locally on behalf of environmental initiatives.

"Purifoy is a man among boys," said Jerry Bridges, head coach of rival Cabot High. "He can play inside, can play outside, he's powerful off the bounce, he can shoot the three ... he's a really tough match-up for anyone."

Purifoy has signed a National Letter of Intent to play basketball on scholarship at the University of Alabama-Birmingham this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
