SKYVIEW HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® IDAHO BOYS BASKETBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 6-foot-4 junior point guard led the Hawks (21-5) to the Class 4A quarterfinals this past season, averaging 21 points, 6.1 assists and six rebounds per game. A two-time First Team All-State selection and the 2009 Class 4A Player of the Year, Dranginis scored 75 points in three state tournament games this season, finishing just five points shy of setting a new Class 4A tournament record.

Dranginis has maintained a 3.61 GPA in the classroom. An active member of his church community, he has volunteered locally on behalf of Shoebox Ministries and has raised funds to benefit breast cancer research.

"The thing that impresses me the most about Dranginis is his composure on the court," said Reggie Guerrero, head coach of rival Columbia High. "He does such a great job leading his team and he plays the point like a 10-year NBA veteran."

Dranginis has verbally committed to play basketball on scholarship at Gonzaga University beginning in the fall of 2011.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by ESPN RISE and the Gatorade high school sports leadership team, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
