## MONTROSE CHRISTIAN SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® MARYLAND BOYS BASKETBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 6-foot-8, 220-pound senior power forward led the Mustangs to a 16-5 record this past season, averaging 20.6 points, 10.7 rebounds and 2.2 blocks per game. Currently ranked No. 18 nationally by ESPNU in the Class of 2010 and as the No. 10 power forward in the country by Scout.com, Hairston earned MVP honors at the Sleepy Thompson tournament earlier this month, recording 15 points and nine rebounds in the tournament final to help beat Episcopal High, 47-38.

Hairston has maintained a 3.26 GPA in the classroom. He has volunteered locally as a youth basketball coach and as a mentor for underprivileged children.

"Josh Hairston is without a doubt one of the greatest high school players I've ever coached and there have been some really good ones," said Montrose Christian Head Coach Stu Vetter. "There's a reason why he's going to Duke. He does everything right on the basketball court."

Hairston has signed a National Letter of Intent to play basketball on scholarship at Duke University this fall.
