FOREST HILL HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® MISSISSIPPI BOYS BASKETBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Stringer has maintained a B average in the classroom. He has volunteered locally on behalf of the Fellowship of Christian Athletes.

"Andre Stringer does everything for that team," said Wayne Brent, head coach of rival Callaway High. "He can really, really shoot the basketball, with great range. As soon as he's over halfcourt, he's a threat."

Stringer has signed a National Letter of Intent to play basketball on scholarship at Louisiana State University this fall.
