FARGO NORTH HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® NORTH DAKOTA BOYS BASKETBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-10, 185-pound senior guard led the Spartans (20-5) to the Class A semifinals this past season, averaging 21.4 points, 5.5 rebounds, 4.7 assists and 2.5 steals per game. A 2010 First Team All-Tournament selection and a two-time First Team All-State honoree, Savageau led the Eastern Dakota Conference in scoring and led his team in points, assists, steals and blocks. Savageau also scored 31 points in a season-ending loss to Bismarck High in the Class A semifinals.

Savageau has maintained a B average in the classroom. He has volunteered locally as a youth basketball coach, on behalf of the Special Olympics and has raised funds to benefit ALS research.

"Nik Savageau brings so much energy to the team whenever he steps onto the floor," said Fargo North Head Coach Dan Shultis. "He's a great scorer but he also knows how to get the ball into the hands of his teammates. He's always come up big for us."

Savageau has signed a National Letter of Intent to play basketball on scholarship at University of Sioux Falls this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by ESPN RISE and the Gatorade high school sports leadership team, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
