HALF HOLLOW HILLS HIGH SCHOOL WEST STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® NEW YORK BOYS BASKETBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

E ntering the postseason's final four, Harris boasted averages of 25.0 points, 14.4 rebounds, 3.7 assists and 3.2 blocks per game. A finalist for the Naismith Boys High School Player of the Year Award, Harris has been selected to play in both the Jordan Brand Classic and the McDonald's High School All-American games. He is ranked as the No. 5 senior in the country by ESPN RISE and is a member of the 2010 USA Basketball Junior National Select Team.

Harris has maintained a B average in the classroom. An active member of his church community, he has volunteered locally on behalf of local clothing drives.

"Tobias Harris has a lot of tools in his toolbox," said Steve Rebholz, head coach of rival Copiague High. "He can handle the ball with skill. He sees the floor very well and he's a proficient passer. He has a variety of low post moves and he's a constant threat from the outside as well."

Harris has signed a National Letter of Intent to play basketball on scholarship at the University of Tennessee this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
