## LAFAYETTE HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® LOUISIANA BOYS TRACK & FIELD ATHLETE OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-9 junior captured the pole vault at the Class 5A state meet this past season with a leap of 16 feet, 1 inch. Duplantis has won three state pole vault titles outdoors and two indoors. He also took first at the Great Southwest Classic with a vault of 16 feet, 6 inches, the No. 12 mark in the nation at the time of his selection.

Duplantis has maintained an unweighted 3.56 GPA in the classroom. He has volunteered locally on behalf of youth track programs.

"Andreas is a superb athlete who has good strength and can run well," said Lafayette Head Coach Keith Calvert. "His dedication to the sport is tremendous, and his work ethic is what gets him over the top."

Duplantis will begin his senior year of high school this fall.
