J.Z. GEORGE HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® MISSISSIPPI BOYS TRACK & FIELD ATHLETE OF THE YEAR

The 6-foot-6 senior cleared a state record 7 feet, 2.25 inches to win the high jump at the Class 2A state meet this past season, and led the Jaguars to their fourth consecutive state title as a team. Jackson's winning jump was the fifth-highest in the nation at the time of his selection. He also topped the field in the triple jump with a leap of 44-3 and was fourth in the long jump.

Jackson has maintained a B average in the classroom. He has volunteered locally on behalf of youth basketball programs.

"He's an unbelievably hard worker with a team first attitude," said J.Z. George Head Coach Heath Dudley. "He's a young man who will do great things."

Jackson has signed a National Letter of Intent to compete on an athletic scholarship at Mississippi State University this
