VILLA MARIA ACADEMY STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® PENNSYLVANIA GIRLS BASKETBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Entering the postseason, McBride boasted averages of 21.0 points, 11.8 rebounds, 5.6 steals, 4.9 assists and 2.7 blocks per game. Her school's all-time leading scorer, she led Villa Maria to the 2009 state crown and has been selected to play in this month's McDonald's High School All-American Game.

McBride has maintained a 3.51 GPA in the classroom. An active member of her school's campus ministry, she has volunteered as an intern in her school's main office and has assisted in coordinating Villa Maria's freshman retreat.

"McBride is the leader that every coach dreams of," said Terry Frontino, head coach of rival North East High. "Every time we player against her she does something different or makes a play that turns the game around—a great pass, a strong drive, a put-back or late game free throws."

McBride has signed a National Letter of Intent to play basketball on scholarship at the University of Notre Dame this fall.
