CONCORD HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® NEW HAMPSHIRE SOFTBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (June 9, 2010) — In its 25th year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with ESPN RISE, today announced Kelsey Martel of Concord High School as its 2009-10 Gatorade New Hampshire Softball Player of the Year. Martel is the second Gatorade New Hampshire Softball Player of the Year to be chosen from Concord High School.

The 5-foot-8 junior right-handed pitcher led the Crimson Tide (20-1) to the semifinals of the Class L state tournament, scheduled for June 9. At the time of her selection, Martel owned a 16-1 record with a 0.65 ERA and 147 strikeouts in 99.1 innings, holding opposing hitters to a .152 batting average. A member of the Concord 14U All-Star team in club competition, Martel had thrown a pair of no-hitters this season averaging 10.3 strikeouts per outing through 17 games this season.

Martel has maintained a 93.9 average in the classroom. An active member of her church community, she has volunteered locally as part of multiple community service initiatives in association with the National Honor Society.

"We couldn't have asked for any more than what Kelsey Martel has given us this season," said Concord High Head Coach Duke Sawyer. "She really stepped up when we needed it and she's been one of the best pitchers in the state."

Martel will begin her senior year of high school this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by ESPN RISE and the Gatorade high school sports leadership team, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.

Martel joins recent Gatorade New Hampshire Softball Players of the Year Paige Hansen (2008-09, Concord) and Amanda Barton (2007-08 & 2006-07, Franklin) among the state's list of former award winners.
