## ESSEX HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® VERMONT SOFTBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-8 sophomore right-handed pitcher owned a 13-1 record this season with a 0.16 ERA entering the Division I semifinals against Missisquoi. An Honorable Mention All-Metro selection as a freshman, Perry had recorded 151 strikeouts in 88.1 innings at the time of her selection, leading the Hornets to a 17-1 record. She also helped Essex to the 2009 state title.

Perry has maintained an A average in the classroom. An active member of her church youth group, she has volunteered locally on behalf of youth sports programs.

"She's young, but she has great composure," said Bert Berthiaume, head coach of rival Bellows Free Academy. "She's the hardest thrower that I've seen this year, and she's got a devastating changeup."

Perry will begin her junior year of high school this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by ESPN RISE and the Gatorade high school sports leadership team, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.

Perry joins recent Gatorade Vermont Softball Players of the Year Stephanie Frank (2008-09 & 2007-08, Essex) and Amanda Downey (2006-07, Essex) among the state's list of former award winners.
