## GONZAGA COLLEGE HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA BOYS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-8, 155-pound senior defender recorded eight goals and six assists this past season, leading the Eagles (17-7-1) to the Washington Catholic Athletic Conference Tournament championship game. A Washington Post First Team All-Met selection, Wilkins was a First Team All-WCAC selection and a three-year starter for Gonzaga. He concluded his prep soccer career with 18 goals and 20 assists.

Wilkins has maintained a 3.37 GPA in the classroom. He has volunteered locally at an area homeless shelter and food bank and as a youth soccer coach.

"Joey Wilkins is a tough defender and a hard worker," said Judah Cooks, Wilkins' club coach with DC United. "He's an outstanding leader for his high school team. He doesn't shy away from tackles. He's very tough."

Wilkins has signed a National Letter of Intent to play soccer on scholarship at Loyola University Maryland this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
