BILLINGS WEST HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® MONTANA BOYS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-10, 150-pound junior midfielder and defender recorded three goals and eight assists this past season, leading the Bears (12-3-1) to the Class AA state semifinals. A three-time Academic All-State selection, Keene was also an Eastern Division First Team All-State pick. He scored a goal for Billings West in the 2009 state championship game, helping the Bears to their second straight state title as a sophomore.

Keene has maintained a 3.48 GPA in the classroom. A member of his school's Ecology Club, he has volunteered locally as a youth soccer coach and mentor in addition to completing service-mission trips to Mexico and New Orleans.

"Anthony Keene is not a real big guy, but he's very quick on the ball and has very good touch," said Paul Zazenski, Keene's club coach with Montana United. "He can run all day and he has very good vision for a high school player."

Keene will begin his senior year of high school this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
