HOLMDEL HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® NEW JERSEY BOYS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (February 23, 2011) — In its 26th year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with ESPN RISE, today announced Dan Metzger of Holmdel High School as its 2010-11 Gatorade New Jersey Boys Soccer Player of the Year. Metzger is the first Gatorade New Jersey Boys Soccer Player of the Year to be chosen from Holmdel High School.

The 5-foot-11, 155-pound senior midfielder led the Hornets to a 22-1 record and the Group III state championship this past season. Metzger recorded 16 goals and 16 assists, including both goals in Holmdel's 2-1 win over Chatham High in the state title game. A 2010 ESPN RISE First Team All-American selection and a member of the U.S. Soccer Under-18 Men's National Team that traveled to Israel for a tournament in December, Metzger was also the Newark Star Ledger's Monmouth County Player of the Year and a First-Team All-State pick.

Metzger has maintained a B average in the classroom. He has volunteered locally as a youth soccer coach and mentor.

"Danny Metzger is an all-around midfielder," said Paul O'Donnell, Metzger's club coach with the New York Red Bulls. "He goes 18-yard box to 18-yard box, he attacks, he defends, he has energy, stamina and work rate. He's been tough to match. I've not seen many better midfielders, if any. He's definitely one of the top midfielders in the country."

Metzger has signed a National Letter of Intent to play soccer on scholarship at the University of Maryland this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by ESPN RISE and the Gatorade high school sports leadership team, which work with top sportspecific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.

Metzger joins recent Gatorade New Jersey Boys Soccer Players of the Year Jon Aguirre (2009-10, Madison), Rafael Diaz (2008-09, Morris Hills), and Matt Kassel (2007-08, Bridgewater-Raritan) among the state's list of former award winners.
