The 5-foot-11 senior goalkeeper led the Packers to a 13-5-3 record and the state championship this past season. Schmid recorded six shutouts and a 1.05 goals against average, and was named North Dakota's Co-Senior Athlete of the Year. He was a First Team All-State selection and a member of the State All-Tournament Team.

Schmid has maintained a 4.17 GPA in the classroom. A member of the National Honor Society and his school's Principal's Advisory Committee, he has volunteered locally with youth baseball and soccer programs.

"You have to have a good defense to win a title and Schmid was the best defender on the field," said Nick Christianson, head coach of rival Fargo Davies High. "He was like a coach out on the field for that team."

Schmid remains undecided upon a collegiate destination.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by ESPN RISE and the Gatorade high school sports leadership team, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
