## CHARLESTON CATHOLIC HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® WEST VIRGINIA BOYS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-8 junior forward led the Fighting Irish to a 19-4-2 record and the Class AA-A state championship this past season. Trupo recorded 25 goals and 10 assists, including three unassisted goals in the title game victory over Oak Hill. He was named Captain of the West Virginia Sports Writers Association All-State Team and was selected Class AA-A Player of the Year by the West Virginia Soccer Coaches Association.

Trupo has maintained a 3.64 GPA in the classroom. He has volunteered locally on behalf of an area food bank and retirement center.

"Trupo is a game-changer," said Steve Cogar, head coach of rival Ravenswood High. "He can score against anybody. He's fast, he's agile and his conditioning is beyond belief."

Trupo will begin his senior year of high school this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by ESPN RISE and the Gatorade high school sports leadership team, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
