GALLUP HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® NEW MEXICO GIRLS BASKETBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-8 senior guard and forward led the Bengals to a 24-4 record entering the Class 4A state semifinals against Roswell High, scheduled for March 10. A McDonald's High School All-American nominee, Prairie Chief has averaged 21.1 points, 12.5 rebounds, 6.4 steals and 3.0 assists per game. Also the All-District Player of the Year and a two-time returning First Team All-District selection, is shooting 59 percent from the field, 48 percent from 3-point range and 73 percent from the free-throw line while producing 20 double-doubles and one triple-double this season.

Also a cross country and track standout, Prairie Chief has maintained a B average in the classroom. In addition to donating her time as a youth basketball instructor and peer mediator, she has volunteered locally on behalf of clothing drives, tree-planting initiatives and cleanup efforts.

"Prairie Chief is such a smart player," said Patrick Puentes, head coach of rival Rio Rancho High. "She's a great rebounder, and she involves her teammates. I've seen Prairie Chief be very unselfish and score 10 points, and seen her go off for 25 points. She does whatever her team needs to win."

Prairie Chief remains undecided regarding a collegiate destination.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
