CICERO-NORTH SYRACUSE HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® NEW YORK GIRLS BASKETBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (March 10, 2011) — In its 26th year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with ESPN RISE, today announced Breanna Stewart of Cicero-North Syracuse High School as its 2010-11 Gatorade New York Girls Basketball Player of the Year. Stewart is the first Gatorade New York Girls Basketball Player of the Year to be chosen from Cicero-North Syracuse High School.

The 6-foot-4 junior forward has led the Northstars to a 19-2 record, the Section 3 Class AA championship and a berth in the Class AA state tournament against Shaker, scheduled for March 12. At the time of her selection, Stewart was averaging 24.4 points, 11.2 rebounds, 5.4 blocks, 3.6 assists and 3.0 steals per game. A starter for the USA Basketball Women's U17 World Championship Team last summer, she led that squad in steals and blocks, ranking second in points and rebounds. Stewart was a Second Team All-State selection and a Fourth Team *Parade* All-American as a sophomore in 2010.

Stewart has maintained an A average in the classroom. She has volunteered locally on behalf of the Ronald McDonald House, the March of Dimes, the North Syracuse Optimist Girls Basketball Program and as part of a youth literacy-outreach program.

"Breanna Stewart is just plain unbelievable," said Mike Olley, head coach of rival Liverpool. "She can run the floor, throw an 80-foot pass on the money, block 3-pointers. I've never seen a kid do what she does."

Stewart has verbally committed to play basketball on scholarship at the University of Connecticut and will begin her senior year of high school this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by ESPN RISE and the Gatorade high school sports leadership team, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.

Stewart joins recent Gatorade New York Girls Basketball Players of the Year Bria Hartley (2008-09 & 2009-10, North Babylon) and Samantha Prahalis (2007-08, Commack) among the state's list of former award winners.
