BISHOP MCNAMARA HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® MARYLAND BOYS BASKETBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (March 17, 2011) — In its 26th year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with ESPN RISE, today announced Marcus Thornton of Bishop McNamara High School as its 2010-11 Gatorade Maryland Boys Basketball Player of the Year. Thornton is the first Gatorade Maryland Boys Basketball Player of the Year to be chosen from Bishop McNamara High School.

The award, which recognizes not only outstanding athletic excellence, but also high standards of academic achievement and exemplary character demonstrated on and off the court, distinguishes Thornton as Maryland's best high school boys basketball player. The 6-foot-3, 190-pound senior shooting guard averaged 23.1 points, 4.7 rebounds, 2.3 assists and 1.7 steals this past season, leading the Mustangs (21-9) to the Washington Catholic Athletic Conference semifinals. A 2011 Washington Post All-Met selection and the 2011 WCAC Player of the Year, he is Bishop McNamara's career leader in 3-point field goal percentage (44 percent) and ranks second in career points (1,176).

Thornton has maintained a 3.18 GPA in the classroom. He has volunteered as a tutor at his school in addition to donating his time on behalf of the Special Olympics as well as food and clothing drives for the needy.

"Marcus Thornton is a phenomenal player," said Blair Mills, head coach of rival Our Lady of Good Counsel High. "Rarely do people put up the kind of numbers he has in the WCAC and consistently shown that kind of dominance."

Thornton has signed a National Letter of Intent to play basketball on scholarship at the College of William & Mary this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by ESPN RISE and the Gatorade high school sports leadership team, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.

Thornton joins recent Gatorade Maryland Boys Basketball Players of the Year Josh Hairston (2009-10, Montrose Christian School), Christian Webster (2008-09, Landon School), and Sean Mosley (2007-08, St. Frances Academy), among the state's list of former award winners.
