Jefferson averaged 17.7 points, 9.7 rebounds and 1.9 blocks per game. The nation's No. 9 junior as rated by ESPNU, he is a two-time First Team All-Friends League selection.

Jefferson has maintained a B average in the classroom. He has volunteered locally on behalf of the Police Athletic League and youth sports programs.

"He's got good footwork and finishes in different ways around the hoop," said Seth Eilberg, head coach of rival Hill School. "He can also face up and shoot it, or put the ball on the floor. He was dominant both times we played them."

Jefferson will begin his senior year of high school this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by ESPN RISE and the Gatorade high school sports leadership team, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.

Jefferson joins recent Gatorade Pennsylvania Boys Basketball Players of the Year Tony Chennault (2009-10, Neumann-Goretti), Maalik Wayns (2008-09, Roman Catholic), and Brian Walsh (2007-08, Moon Area), among the state's list of former award winners.
