## ROCKLIN HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® CALIFORNIA BOYS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-9, 155-pound senior midfielder recorded five goals and five assists this past season, leading the Thunder (14-4-6) to the San-Joaquin Section Division II semifinals. A member of the U.S. Soccer Federation Under-18 Men's National Team, Casiple played as a defensive midfielder for Rocklin after spending his first three years as an attacking player. Casiple is a two-time Sierra Foothills League First Team selection and also served as the place kicker for the Rocklin High football team last fall. He concluded his prep soccer career with 19 goals and 35 assists.

Casiple has maintained a 3.18 GPA in the classroom. He has volunteered locally as a coach with the Rocklin High girls soccer team and completed a service mission trip to Mexico, where he helped build houses.

"Seth Casiple's strength is his vision in the middle of the field and his quality of pass," said Paul O'Brien, Casiple's club coach with the California Development Academy. "His all-around technical game is pretty big-time. For me, of all the players I've been around, I've yet to see a player who stands out as much as he does in the center of the field."

Casiple has signed a National Letter of Intent to play soccer on scholarship at the University of California-Berkeley this
