PUNAHOU SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® HAWAII BOYS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-7, 135-pound senior midfielder led the Buff n' Blu to an 11-2-1 record and the Division I state title this past season. Granger scored eight goals and passed for eight assists as a central midfielder. The *Honolulu Star-Advertiser* State Player of the Year, Granger was also the Interscholastic League of Hawaii Offensive Player of the Year. He concluded his prep soccer career with 11 goals and 19 assists.

Granger has maintained a 3.54 GPA in the classroom. A ukulele and guitar player, he has volunteered locally as a youth soccer coach and as a member of Punahou's Super Fan Club, promoting school spirit.

"Not only for his high school team but also for his club team, Scott Granger was the catalyst," said Phil Neddo, the Director of Coaching for the Honolulu Bulls club team. "He's a great playmaker. I would say of his skills on the ball that he's the best in the state. He's just a very talented player with the ball at his feet."

Granger will be attending Creighton University this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by ESPN RISE and the Gatorade high school sports leadership team, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.

Granger joins recent Gatorade Hawaii Boys Soccer Players of the Year Cody Sullivan (2009-10, Mid-Pacific Institute), Nick Goo (2008-09, Iolani School), and Zane Dydasco (2007-08, Kamehameha Schools-Kapalama) among the state's list of former award winners.
