INDIAN RIVER HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE DELAWARE GIRLS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-3 senior forward has led the Indians to a 10-2 record entering this week's regular-season contest with Seaford, scheduled for May 12. Forte scored 15 goals and passed for 13 assists through 12 games. She was a First Team All-State selection each of the last two seasons.

Forte has maintained an A-plus average in the classroom. A devoted member of her church community, she has volunteered locally on behalf of youth sports programs and the U.S. Marine Corps Toys for Tots Foundation.

"Forte is very dynamic," said Ryan Buchanan, head coach of rival Smyrna High. "She's got great speed, she plays well with both feet and she's always dangerous with the ball."

Forte has signed a National Letter of Intent to play soccer on scholarship at Villanova University this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by ESPN RISE and the Gatorade high school sports leadership team, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
