PALO VERDE HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE NEVADA GIRLS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

A member of the U.S. Soccer Federation Under-17 Women's National Team, Kaskie was the Northwest League Player of the Year and a First Team All-Sunset Region selection. She is the No. 8 recruit in the Class of 2013 as ranked by *TopDrawerSoccer.com*.

Kaskie has maintained a 3.72 GPA in the classroom. She has volunteered locally by delivering charitable donations to needy families and on behalf of Children Mending Hearts, an arts organization for homeless children.

"Lauren is a very solid player all-around and has a good understanding of the game," said Jen Klein, the girls director of the Nevada Youth Soccer Association's Olympic Development Program. "She can play anywhere on the field. She proves that in high school, club and even the national team—she plays different positions for all of them."

Kaskie will begin her junior year of high school this fall.
