JENKS HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE OKLAHOMA GIRLS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Keester has maintained a 4.0 GPA in the classroom. She has volunteered locally on behalf of the Special Olympics and a youth anti-drug initiative.

"Keester can be a game-changer at any time," said Sam Bowers, head coach of rival Owasso High. "She's athletic, fast and can really strike a ball well."

Keester will begin her junior year of high school this fall.
