## ARCHBISHOP SPALDING HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® MARYLAND BASEBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Neary batted .585 with six home runs, 34 RBIs and 31 runs scored. A 2010 First Team All-Conference selection, Neary struck out only three times in 78 plate appearances this season.

Neary has maintained a B average in the classroom. An avid and championship-winning fisherman, he has volunteered locally on behalf of food and clothing drives for the needy.

"Austin Neary is a very good baseball player who absolutely crushed the ball in the games where we faced him," said Larry Prange, head coach of rival Bishop McNamara. "He's also a terrific fielder and just a first rate all around ballplayer."

Neary has signed a National Letter of Intent to play baseball on scholarship at Western Carolina University this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
