SIERRA VISTA HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® NEVADA BASEBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (June 1, 2011) — In its 26th year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with ESPN RISE, today announced Jake Hager of Sierra Vista High School as its 2010-11 Gatorade Nevada Baseball Player of the Year. The 6-foot-1, 190-pound senior shortstop and right-handed pitcher batted .533 with 11 home runs, 54 RBIs, 73 runs scored and a .635 on-base percentage, leading the Mountain Lions (34-4) to the Class 4A regional tournament. The 2011 Southern Nevada Player of the Year, Hager also posted a 3-2 record on the mound with a 2.43 ERA and 31 strikeouts in 31.2 innings pitched.

Hager has maintained a 3.72 weighted GPA in the classroom. He has volunteered locally on behalf of multiple community service initiatives in association his church youth group and as a youth baseball camp counselor.

"Jake Hager is a great player who respects his teammates and coaches all around the city," said Nick Didier, head coach of rival Liberty High. "His love for the game shows in his hustle and attitude. We wish all student-athletes could be like Jake Hager."

Hager has signed a National Letter of Intent to play baseball on scholarship at Arizona State University this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by ESPN RISE and the Gatorade high school sports leadership team, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.

Hager joins recent Gatorade Nevada Baseball Players of the Year Kris Bryant (2009-10, Bonanza), Jeff Malm (2008-09; Bishop Gorman), Jeff Malm (2007-08, Bishop Gorman), and Taylor Cole (2006-07, Bishop Gorman College Prep), among the state's list of former award winners.
