LIVINGSTON MANOR HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® NEW YORK SOFTBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (June 9, 2011) — In its 26th year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with ESPN RISE, today announced Marissa Diescher of Livingston Manor High School as its 2010-11 Gatorade New York Softball Player of the Year. Diescher is the first Gatorade Softball Player of the Year to be chosen from Livingston Manor High School.

The 5-foot-9 senior right-handed pitcher has led the Wildcats (16-1) to a berth in the state Class D semifinals, scheduled for June 11. At the time of her selection, Diescher owned a 12-1 record on the mound with a 0.16 ERA and 220 strikeouts in 89 innings. She batted .557 with six home runs and 35 RBI through 17 games. A two-time First Team All-State selection, Diescher was the Class D co-Player of the Year in 2010.

Diescher has maintained an A average in the classroom. Also a basketball standout, she has volunteered locally on behalf of youth softball and basketball programs.

"Diescher is absolutely outstanding," said Mike Becker, head coach of rival Chester Academy. "She throws hard and doesn't put anything over the center of the plate. She's a very, very good hitter too."

Diescher has signed a National Letter of Intent to play softball on scholarship at Penn State University this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by ESPN RISE and the Gatorade high school sports leadership team, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.

Diescher joins recent Gatorade New York Softball Players of the Year Tammy Wray (2009-10, Somers), Olivia Galati (2008-09, St. John the Baptist) and Cassie Reilly-Boccia (2007-08, Yorktown), among the state's list of former award winners.
