ST. PAUL'S EPISCOPAL SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE ALABAMA GIRLS TRACK & FIELD ATHLETE OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (June 21, 2011) — In its 26th year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with ESPN RISE, today announced Lacey Dent of St. Paul's Episcopal School as its 2010-11 Gatorade Alabama Girls Track & Field Athlete of the Year. Dent is the third Gatorade Alabama Girls Track & Field Athlete of the Year to be chosen from St. Paul's Episcopal School.

The award, which recognizes not only outstanding athletic excellence, but also high standards of academic achievement and exemplary character demonstrated on and off the track, distinguishes Dent as Alabama's best high school girls track & field athlete. Now a finalist for the prestigious Gatorade National Girls Track & Field Athlete of the Year award to be announced in June, Dent joins an elite alumni association of state award-winners in 12 sports, including Allyson Felix (2001-02, Los Angeles Baptist, Calif.), Derek Jeter (1991-92, Kalamazoo HS, Mich.), Candace Parker (2001-02, Naperville Central HS, Ill.), Abby Wambach (1997-98, Our Lady of Mercy, N.Y.), Mark Sanchez (2004-05, Mission Viejo HS, Calif.), Lolo Jones (1997-98, Roosevelt HS, Ia.) and Bianca Knight (2006-07, Ridgeland HS, Miss.).

The 5-foot-7 junior won three individual state championships this spring and led the Saints to a sixth consecutive Class 5A state championship as a team. The state's returning Gatorade Girls Track & Field Athlete of the Year, Dent captured the 100-meter high hurdles with a time of 14.39 seconds, the 300-meter intermediate hurdles in 46.25 seconds and the heptathlon with 4,437 points. She also finished second in the long jump and third in the triple jump.

Dent has maintained a weighted 4.20 GPA in the classroom. A member of her school's student government, she has volunteered locally on behalf of youth track programs and an area homeless shelter.

"She competed all spring while suffering from mononucleosis, which we didn't discover until after the season ended," said St. Paul's Head Coach Jim Tate. "But she was still able to win championships and accomplish so much."

Dent will begin her senior year of high school this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by ESPN RISE and the Gatorade high school sports leadership team, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.

Dent joins recent Gatorade Alabama Girls Track & Field Athletes of the Year Neal Tisher (2008-09, St. Paul's Episcopal School) and Madeline Morgan (2007-08, Mountain Brook) among the state's list of former award winners.
