**BILLINGS SENIOR HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED
GATORADE MONTANA GIRLS TRACK & FIELD ATHLETE OF THE YEAR**

CHICAGO (June 21, 2011) — In its 26th year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with ESPN RISE, today announced Danielle Aragon of Billings Senior High School as its 2010-11 Gatorade Montana Girls Track & Field Athlete of the Year. Aragon is the first Gatorade Montana Girls Track & Field Athlete of the Year to be chosen from Billings Senior High School.

The award, which recognizes not only outstanding athletic excellence, but also high standards of academic achievement and exemplary character demonstrated on and off the track, distinguishes Aragon as Montana's best high school girls track & field athlete. Now a finalist for the prestigious Gatorade National Girls Track & Field Athlete of the Year award to be announced in June, Aragon joins an elite alumni association of state award-winners in 12 sports, including Allyson Felix (2001-02, Los Angeles Baptist, Calif.), Derek Jeter (1991-92, Kalamazoo HS, Mich.), Candace Parker (2001-02, Naperville Central HS, Ill.), Abby Wambach (1997-98, Our Lady of Mercy, N.Y.), Mark Sanchez (2004-05, Mission Viejo HS, Calif.), Lolo Jones (1997-98, Roosevelt HS, Ia.) and Bianca Knight (2006-07, Ridgeland HS, Miss.).

The 5-foot-6 junior distance runner won three individual state championships this spring and led the Lady Broncs to the Class AA state title as a team. Aragon won the 800-meter run with a time of 2:11.96, the 1600-meter run in 5:02.79 and the 3200-meter run, breaking the tape in 11:14.22. A 2011 Academic All-State selection, Aragon was undefeated against in-state competition in both the 1600 and 3200 this season and her time of 2:11.40 in the 800 at the Eastern AA Divisional Track Meet was Montana's fastest this year, ranking among the nation's top 60 performances by a prep competitor in 2011 at the time of her selection.

Aragon has maintained a 3.93 GPA in the classroom. A member of the National Honor Society, she has volunteered locally as a youth mentor and on behalf of the Smile Network, an international fundraising initiative which provides reconstructive healthcare services to repair birth and genetic defects.

"Danielle Aragon is a wonderful inspiration to all others on the track team," said Billings Senior High Head Coach David Creger. "She works hard at each and every meet and practice and her humble attitude toward others is something I greatly admire."

Aragon will begin her senior year of high school this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by ESPN RISE and the Gatorade high school sports leadership team, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.

Aragon joins recent Gatorade Montana Girls Track & Field Athletes of the Year Kellee Glaus (2009-10, Whitehall), Alexa Aragon (2008-09, Billings Senior), and Melissa Jenkins (2007-08, Big Sky) among the state's list of former award winners.
