KENAI CENTRAL HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® ALASKA FOOTBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (December 1, 2011) — In its 27th year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes,, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with ESPNHS, today announced A.J. Hull of Kenai Central High School as its 2011-12 Gatorade Alaska Football Player of the Year. Hull is the second Gatorade Alaska Football Player of the Year to be chosen from Kenai Central High School.

The 5-foot-11, 180-pound senior quarterback, defensive back, punt and kick returner led the Kardinals to a 6-4 record and the Medium School state championship this past season. Hull passed for 816 yards and nine touchdowns, completing 32-of-102 attempts while throwing nine interceptions. The 2011Alaska School Activities Association Medium School Offensive Player of the Year, he also rushed for 933 yards and 14 touchdowns on 162 carries and amassed 96 tackles and six interceptions on defense.

Hull has maintained a 3.67 GPA in the classroom. He has volunteered locally on behalf of multiple charitable fundraising campaigns and as a youth football coach and referee.

"A.J. Hull is a fantastic athlete and leader," said Norm Bouchard, head coach of rival Houston High. "He makes everyone around him better and he leads his teammates to levels they never would have thought possible on their own."

Hull remains undecided upon a college destination.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by ESPNHS and the Gatorade high school sports leadership team, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.

Hull joins recent Gatorade Alaska Football Players of the Year Robbie Smithwick (2010-11, Soldotna High School) Justin Kauffman (2009-10, West Anchorage), Anthony Griglione (2008-09, Soldotna High School) and Bill Chimphalee (2007-08, Kenai Central) among the state's list of former award winners.
