MERCY HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® MICHIGAN VOLLEYBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Doyle has maintained a 3.51 GPA in the classroom. A member of her school's French Club and Science Club, she has volunteered locally as a Catholic Youth Organization camp counselor and as a youth volleyball coach.

"Maddy Doyle has the ability to completely take over a game," said Mercy High Head Coach Loretta Vogel. "Her knowledge of the game is well beyond that of most college athletes. She is a true leader on and off the court."

Doyle has signed a National Letter of Intent to play volleyball on scholarship at George Washington University beginning in the fall of 2012.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by ESPNHS and the Gatorade high school sports leadership team, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
