CHICAGO (May 15, 2012) — In its 27th year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with ESPNHS, today announced Brian James of American Heritage School of Boca/Delray as its 2011-12 Gatorade Florida Boys Soccer Player of the Year. The 5-foot-11, 140-pound senior midfielder scored 24 goals and passed for 55 assists this past season, leading the Stallions to the Class 2A state semifinals. A 2011 ESPNHS First Team All-American selection and a two-time Palm Beach Post Player of the Year, James has been a member of the U.S. Soccer Under-18 Men's National Team player pool. He concluded his prep soccer career with 78 goals and 168 assists.

James has maintained a weighted 4.52 GPA in the classroom. He has volunteered locally at a retirement home, as a youth soccer coach and on behalf of the Easter Seals.

"Brian is the difference-maker on most teams he plays on," said Jerry Willenborg, the director of the Weston FC club team. "He plays harder when the team is down, he usually scores game-winners and he is very focused on his game."

James has signed a National Letter of Intent to play soccer on an athletic scholarship at the University of Virginia this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by ESPNHS and the Gatorade high school sports leadership team, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
